

## DESCRIPTION

6. Briefly describe the present physical appearance of the site or structure and describe any major alterations from its original condition:

This building was constructed in 1933 on the site of the old St. James Hotel by Ralph Wyckoff. The Spanish Colonial Revival style is a prime example of the high quality of federal building construction in past decades. The building is noted for the ornate Chimgurresque ornament surrounding its twin entrances and the high decorative interior lobby with marble floors, brass lighting fixtures, and wood ceilings. Recently the city has moved the Main Post Office out of the central business district and this building currently serves as the downtown branch, also holding assorted federal offices and courts. The building is rectangular in plan with twin projecting towers at both north and south ends. The red tile roof is low hipped and detailing is provided through the use of stringcourses, modillions and bead and reel under the eaves; and highly ornate window surrounds.
